

Agricultural and animal feed products prohibited from being imported into Latvia from the Russian Federation and the Republic of Belarus

Goods of Section 7 of the EU Combined Nomenclature (CN):

- vegetables, fresh or chilled (potatoes, tomatoes, onions, leeks, garlic, cabbage, cauliflower, kale, lettuce, cucumbers, carrots, turnips, swedes, beetroots, celeriac, radishes, leguminous vegetables (peas, beans, etc.), pumpkins, courgettes, aubergines, celery, mushrooms and truffles, bell peppers (paprika), vegetables of the genus *Capsicum* (hot peppers), spinach, artichokes, olives, capers, fennel, sweet corn, etc.);
- frozen vegetables (all of the above);
- vegetables preserved for short-term storage to ensure transport or storage before use, not intended for immediate consumption (all the above vegetables);
- dried vegetables (onions, mushrooms, potatoes, tomatoes, carrots, etc.);
- dried shelled legumes (peas, lentils, beans, etc. legumes);
- fresh, chilled, frozen or dried vegetables with a high starch or inulin content (manioc, Jerusalem artichokes, sweet potatoes, etc.).

Goods of Section 8 of CN:

- nuts, fresh or dried (coconuts, almonds, hazelnuts, walnuts, pine nuts);
- fruits, fresh or dried (melons, watermelons, bananas, dates, figs, pineapples, avocados, citrus fruits, grapes, apples, pears, apricots, cherries, peaches, nectarines, plums, strawberries, blackcurrants, currants, gooseberries, raspberries, cranberries, blueberries, lingonberries, kiwi, persimmons, etc.);
- frozen fruits and nuts;
- fruits and nuts preserved for short-term storage to ensure transportation or handling before use;
- dried fruits and mixtures thereof; fresh, frozen, dried or short-term preserved peels of citrus fruits, melons or watermelons.

Goods of Section 10 of CN:

- cereal products (wheat, rye, barley, oats, maize, rice, buckwheat (unprocessed), millet, quinoa, etc.).

Goods of Section 23 of CN:

- flours and pellets of meat or meat offal or of fish;
- bran, siftings and other residues resulting from the processing of cereals or leguminous plants;
- residues of starch manufacture;
- beet pulp;
- oilcakes;
- plant-based materials, plant waste, residues and by-products (grape pomace, soybean hulls, etc.), dog or cat food (whether in retail or wholesale packaging), prepared animal fodder (with some exceptions).
